"Let no one say when he is tempted that he is tempted by God, for God cannot be tempted by evil and he himself tempts no one, but each one is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desires, and desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is full-grown brings forth death."

Continuing on from the previous thought of many people seeming to be unable to differentiate between temptation and actual sin, it is vital for us to remember the words of the Spirit of God, through the apostle James, as quoted above.

Nevertheless, with the mighty power of the Spirit of Christ in me, I can say " NO"

to

ALL

temptation, and walk away from it in liberty and victory. This is what Jesus is telling us in **John 8:31-38**

, saying in verses

31 to 32

"If you continue in my word you are truly my disciple, you shall know the truth, and the truth shall set you free."

And in verse

36

he tells us that when

"The Son sets you free you shall be free indeed."

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However, it is easy to overlook what he is saying to us in **verse 34**, "Everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin"

Clearly the freedom he is talking about is the freedom to say an emphatic "NO"

to the temptations which assail us through the desires, lusts and passions of the flesh, and to walk away, knowing complete victory over them. Otherwise, how are we completely free?

So, what the word of God is telling us is that we are free to choose whether we walk in the new nature of **Eph 4:24**, or in the old nature of **Eph 4:22-23**, entertaining and accepting the temptation as our own.
